Wild Peace Sanctuary | Restoration Project | North Beaver Creek Rd

Location:

North Beaver Creek Rd, Seal Rock, OR

Project:

Regenerating an overgrown and degraded pasture on a private property in Western Oregon, employing planned adaptive grazing practices with a small herd of wild horses and burros.

Timeline:

Between Nov, 2022 - April, 2023. Status is ongoing.

Objective:

To demonstrate and document the results of using holistic land management practices with a small mixed herd of wild horses and burros to restore and regenerate an overgrown, degraded pasture. We created several semi-permanent paddocks for rotational grazing, and also used solar powered electric fencing. The herd removed non-native vegetation including Canada thistle and Himalayan blackberry; improved soil health, and increased biodiversity by naturally fertilizing the ground and dispersing native seeds through their manure; and created a wildfire break on the property through the removal of dead grass, blackberry canes, and other combustible materials.
